Fellow member Mr E. Orser has very kindly offered to show coloured slides of Varieties in Canadian Half Dollars.

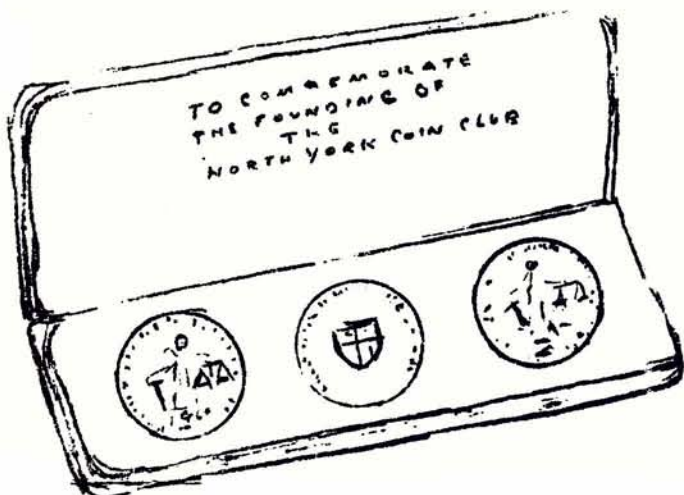
There will be a draw for a 1961 Mint Set, and a second prize, - 1959 Silver Dollar.
