LAST MEETING:

The Guest speaker for last meeting was Inspector R. J. P. Hather of the Metro Toronto Police Department. A long time numismatist, he has dabbled in many facets of the hobby but he believes that to gain maximum enjoyment, one must specialize in one or two fields.

Inspector Hather started collecting coins as a news boy some forty years ago and later acquired material by visiting antique shops and coin stores. Today he specialises in ancient coins and early Canadian tokens, but not by trying to complete any one series. If, for example, a historic event was marked by a token or medal, he would try to acquire one commemorating the victor and another showing the loser, thus completing a "set" with all the historical data of the event contained in the two coins.

Inspector Hather's talk was accompanied by a very interesting display which included an original specimen of French Canadian Card Money, Indian Chief Medals, Puffin Coinage, and ancient coins from Egypt and Rome. His very interesting talk was climaxed with a vigorous question period.
