and a LAST MEETING:

The new executive officially took over at the last meeting with Mr. Stocker in the president's chair. He gave a short acceptance speech and went right on by introducing our guest speaker Dr. Marvin Kay.

Dr. Kay's topic was quite unusual and was entitled "Medical Numismatics".

When Dr. Kay started in this field about two years ago he thought that it would be limited, but not so. He explained that many governments and institutions such as hospitals, nursing schools, pharmacies, universities, etc., have issued med-als, coins, tokens, plaques, bank notes, etc. with the theme of medicine.

His talk was broken into five main catagories and he illustrated the entire speech with over 60 beautiful colour slides of his own personal collection.

The five catagories were as follows: Medals Honouring Physicans such as Dr. Banting, Dr. Tom Dooley, Sir William Osler, Walter Reed and many others. Non Wedical Contributions to Medicine such as Louis Pasteur, and Alexander Graham Bell. Hospitals, such as the John Hopkins Hospital founded in 1889 depicted on a medal on it's 50th and 75th anniversity. Physicians on Joins and Banknotes, and finally Miscellaneous which takes in everything else, such as a medal issued to inspire doctors to submit articles to a certain journal, a plastic

button showing a medieval enema injection, and many other odd but interesting pieces. Dr. Kay concluded his talk by answering many questions from the floor showing the great interest he generated.
