York Coin Club featured Mr. Robert Aaron as speaker. He showed his slides of Europe, and the European Mints. The slides were excellent, and Mr. Aaron's narration was of the utmost interest. The club thoroughly enjoyed his presentation, and in thanks, the club awarded Mr. Aaron with a 1970 Proof like dollar.

In the free attendance draw, Mr. R. Strong won a 1969 Proof Like dollar for being in attendance before 8:00p.m.

Mrs. Louise Graham was presented with a 1970 Proof Like dollar in thanks for many years of dedicated service to the North York Coin Club.

Also at the October meeting, there were three displays: Mr. Farrow's exhibit was of old Toronto nostalgia. It included pictures and articles regarding Toronto's old street cars. The display entered by Mr. Strong contained electrotype copies of two tokens of the French Regime in Canada. One of them, Charlton #1 or Breton #501, is dated 1670, and is of the 15 sol denomination. There was also an exhibit of European paper money, displayed by Michael Zigler, your editor.

In the auction, a 1969 Australian mint set and a set of commemorative subway tokens were sold. The Australian mint set contained the first twelve sided fifty cent piece, while the subway tokens commemorated the extention of the Bloor-Danforth subway line into Scarborough in the east, and Etobicoke in the west.

Altogether, the last meeting was very successful, and all present enjoyed themselves fully.
