LAST MEETING:

The eleventh anniversary meeting of the North York Coin Club was held on February 23, 1971. The meeting contained discussion on the coming coin show, and the various chairmen gave their reports.

The meeting featured a set of slides entitled "AN INTRODUCTION TO THE FASCINATION OF PAPER MONEY" by Harold Don Allen, and loaned to the club by the International Bank Note Society. Some of the interesting slides included a twenty shilling note from the British West African Currency Board issued at Lagos; a one, Balboa note from Panama, and some Canadian notes. Needless to say, the Canadian notes attracted the most attention. Many people saw the devils face in the queen's hair for the first time, on a slide of an early 1954 note. Roger Fox and Michael Zigler both spoke briefly on certain aspects relating to the Canadian notes on the slides such as: Asterisks; serial numbers; plate numbers; counterfeiting and the banknote companies. Some of the scenes on the reverse sides of the notes were identified. All members present enjoyed the slides, and I am sure that everyone learned something.

Two displays were entered at the meeting. Mr. Strong displayed a Montreal and Lachine Railroad Token, along with his extensive research. Michael Zigler's display was entitled The Bank Notes of the World: Decimalization.
