Last Meeting: Seldom has North York had so many distiguished Numismatists on its platform to speak to us, Dr. John S. Wilkinson, E. Victor Snell, Mrs. Louise Graham, James E. Charlton and our President Fredrick C. Jewett.

Mr. Jewett Chaired the meeting and read letters from Major Sheldon S. Carroll and Edwin Echenberg, C.N.A. past presidents, expressing their disappointment on not being able to attend, and asked to be remembered to there old friends.

Dr. Wilkinson spoke first, recalling the joint A.N.A.-C.N.A. Convention in Detroit, the Hamilton and the Vancouver Conventions that were held during his term of office.

Victor Snell, who almost didn't make it to the meeting due to the fire in Oakville, which blocked the railway line, told how he started collecting as a boy, how his collecting interests grew and of the great fellowship enjoyed among collectors. He also spoke of the satisfaction found in research of Numismatics, and recalled various events, humorous and otherwise that happend during his term of office.

Mrs. Louise Graham gave her experience as a very young collector who got discouraged because she couldn't fill in the missing dates in her large Cent and 5¢ Silver Collection, as there were no dealers, no coin clubs or no catalogues available to her, she finally purchased an American Beauty doll and carriage with her collection. It was many years before she found that the missing dates were never issued.

She also told how she met and married her Husband, a coin collector, how she was roped into becoming the treasurer of the Toronto Coin Club, then being talked into becoming the secretary of the C.N.A., the first C.N.A. Convention in 1954, and gave many of her experiences as she participated in the various offices of the C.N.A. that she occupied, and of the various C.N.A. Conventions throughout the years.

Jim Charlton, the current President of the C.N.A., introduced two of his officers of the U.N.A. Pat Turner 2nd. Vice-President and Paul Johnson, Ontario Director, and commended them for their contibrutions in the operation of the C.N.A.

As the first C.N.A. Convention in 1954 had already been brought up by Dr. Wilkinson and Mrs. Graham, Jim Charlton who was auctioneer at that convention, gave us a few of the prices realized at that time, to show how the value of coins have increased.
