The theme for "Coin Week Canada" 1979 is to be "History in your hands",. Combining Canadian and Historical attributes, the logo, now in preparation, will feature the "Voyageur" design of the Canadian Dollar coin and the C.N.A. seal.

Clubs and individuals who entered the 1978 competition are urged to build upon their experience and know-how, and new competitors are invited to bring the benefits of "Coin Week Canada", to additional communities. Volunteers to take on specific tasks on the National committee will be welcomed, particularly to assure continuity of "Coin Week" operation from year to year, Allen notes.
