The Trade Tokens of High River, Alberta

Stan Clute was our guest speaker for the evening. Stan includes in his collecting interests the trade tokens of Albert, but in this presentation he concentrated on the material from High River, the town where he currently resides. He first drew our attention to the excellent book **Alberta Trade Tokens** by Donald M. Stewart and pointed out that four pages in the book are devoted to the tokens of High River. The town is located 40 miles south of Calgary and has grown to a current size of about 6000 citizens. The site of the town was first settled in 1882. The railway came through in 1883 and it was incorporated in 1906. Stan displayed early postcards of the town along with a selection of tokens. These included bakery and dairy tokens, grocery and dry goods tokens and the High River Leather Dollar. This particular piece features the Medicine Tree design which has become a symbol of the town. Other pieces on display were the Powell Bakery, High River Creamery, Spring Creek Dairy and Laidlaw "one price" grocery store tokens.

Stan was thanked by Ron and presented with a set of North York Coin Club Trade Tokens.

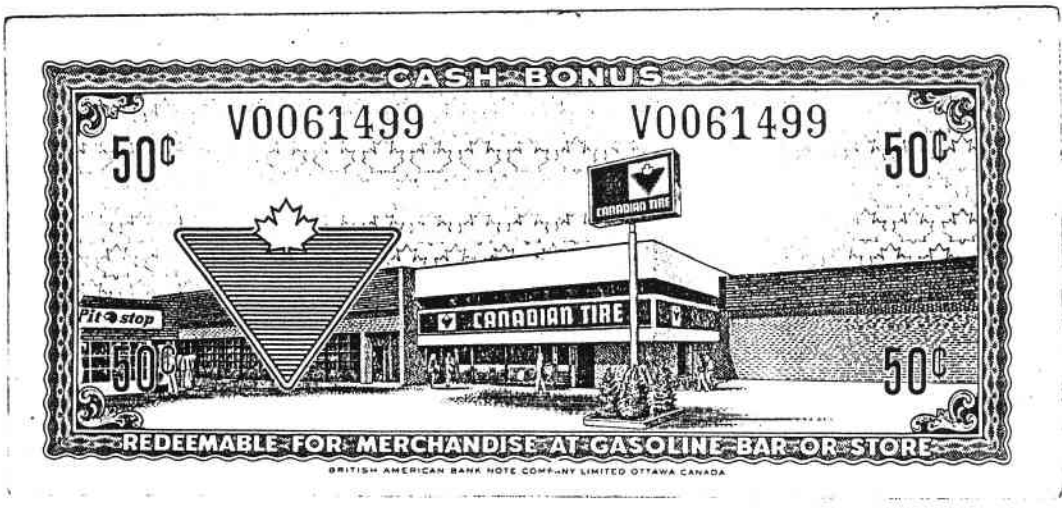
