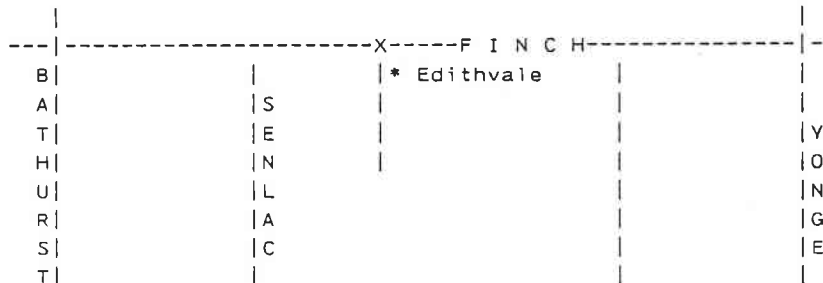

Question-of-the-Month

We had a question of the month for December, but it didn't get answered. Let's get at it this month and find out "How many times has the North York Coin Club hosted the CNA and ONA conventions and in what years?"

For January, this editor thought it would be fun to do a tally of club members' votes on the 1992 Coin of The Year. If you have a copy of the January 18 Canadian Coin News, you will see them on the front page. If you don't, we'll have a copy at the meeting for you to look over so you can make your selection.

Each year a panel of numismatists, mint officials and writers select one coin in eight categories that "embodies the best overall qualities, in particular the qualities of artistry, theme, marketability, popularity and broadness of its appeal to an international audience." For 1992 the finalists are:

- 1) most artistic coin, Italy 500 lire silver;
- 2) best crown, Austria 100 schilling silver;
- 3) best gold coin, United States \$5;
- 4) most historically significant coin, Russia 1 rouble copper nickel;
- 5) most popular coin, United States \$1 silver (beating the Canadian 1992 Parliament dollar)
- 6) best silver coin, Spain 2,000 pesetas silver;
- 7/8) best trade coin and most innovative concept, France 20 francs trimetallic (beating the Canadian 25 cents 1992 with Ontario reverse as the best trade coin and the the Canada 125 25 cents series as the most innovative concept)

If Canada ever had a good chance in the running, it had to surely come with the Canada 125 series and it is a real pity that at least one of these special coins didn't win in one of the categories.

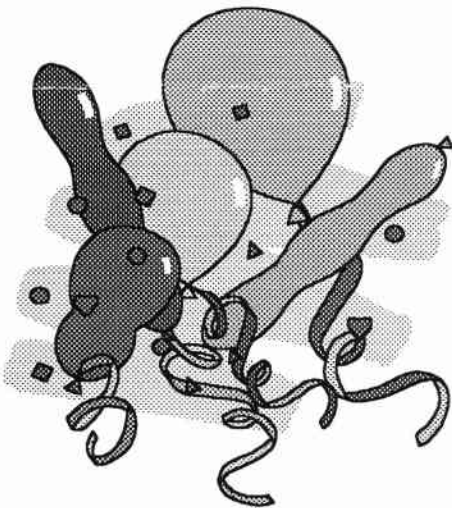

The 1994 ONA Convention will be held at one of North York's well-known landmarks - the Holiday Inn Yorkdale. The 1994 edition of the ONA CONVENTION will be hosted by the North York Coin Club, which was founded in 1960 by a number of members who are still active in the club.

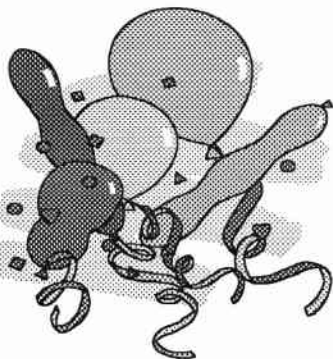

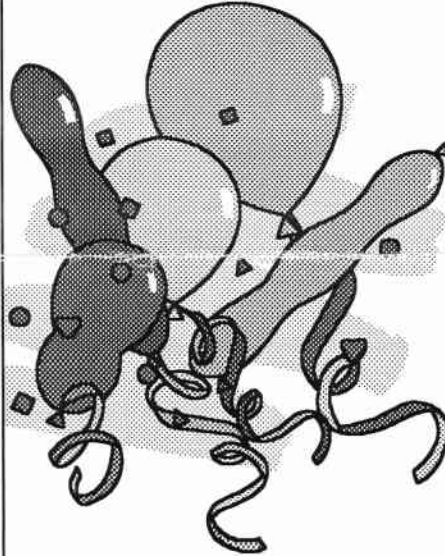
