### Question-of-the-Month

Let's start the New Year off thinking about organized numismatics! What was the first local club organized in Canada? Does anyone know the year of its formation?

The December question asked us to think "away back" to the decimal coins issued by the founding colonies before they joined Confederation. Which ones did **not** issue a twenty-five cent denomination?

This question required that we first identify all the colonies that did strike coins. These were the Province of Canada, British Columbia (\$2 gold), Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. Only Newfoundland issued a 25 cents denomination and it happened to be struck following the establishment of the Royal Canadian Mint. It appeared in 1917 and 1919 and displays a "C" mint mark.
