Paul Petch, one of our young Junior Members gave a talk on the job carried out by our chartered banks here in Canada. One of the main jobs of the bank is to take out of circulation all damaged and worn out currency and replace it with new issues. He gave the life span of the different bills in circulation and explained that if bills managed to get beyond our borders they are promptly returned by the receiver banks.

Roger Fox gave his opinion of the future of Numismatics as far as the collector was concerned. He said that there were very many categories a collector can get into such as foreign coins, gold coins, tokens, varieties and die breaks. The categories are unlimited but the low minted varieties will still be the most valuable in years to come, not forgetting the "mint sets."

A note of interest to members. In April 1960 Messrs. We have been informed that the National Council has at last approved such a badge for Scouts; it is interesting to note that the requirements for the collection itself, except for the addition of one phrase, are exactly those as set forth by the North York Coin Club members.

The National Council in Ottawa invited entries from Scouts all over Canada and we understand the response was tremendous, therefore we are very proud that the requirements submitted by our club to the Lakeland Region, York Summit District at Richmond Hill were accepted.
