There is no indication, as yet, who will succeed him. It looks like we are going to have some more scarce signature notes.

Following this talk, eight junior collectors met for lunch in the Toronto-Dominion building to discuss the progress of the new C. N. A. Junior Program. A successful auction was held by Frank Rose during the afternoon and was followed at 5:00 P. M. by a meeting of the Ancient Coin Society. This meeting featured a talk by Dr. John S. Fred Jewett, first Vice-President of the C. N. A. and second Vice-President of our club acted as moderator of this talk as well as the speech by Paul Johnson.
