NEXT MEETING: The first meeting of the North York Coin Club for the new year will be held at the North York Memorial Community Hall, 5090 Yonge Street, at 8:00 P. M., Tuesday, January 23, 1973. This will be a C. N. A. Night. Our guest, Mr. Frank Rose, Editor of the Canadian Numismatic Journal, will moderate an informal panel discussion about numismatics, with emphasis upon the Canadian Numismatic Association. Hope to see you there: bring a friend with you.

LAST MEETING: Our Christmas party was held at the Community Hall at 8:00 P. M., December 19, 1972. Roger Fox showed colour movies of some of the club's old Christmas parties from 1962 to 1966. Harvey Farrow commented upon a mint set which he had received from the Mint with the plastic unsealed. Dr. J. S. Wilkinson read a letter which he had received from the American Numismatic Society regarding the coin collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Outgoing President Harvey Farrow called upon Roger Fox to accept the office of President of the club for 1973.

We asked for displays of material other than coins and received some fine exhibits. Harvey Farrow displayed some tokens and old streetcar tickets; Ken Bunnett exhibited a number of old Bibles and prayer books, some of which dated as early as the sixteenth century; May Bunnett showed a case of matchbooks; Lucille Colson brought a set of antique wood moulding planes; Stan Clute exhibited some old coin and history books, dating between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries.

The two door prizes were won by Mrs. Louise Graham and Stan Clute.

After the meeting adjourned, a delicious buffet dinner was served by the ladies and everyone settled down to some pleasant numismatic chats.

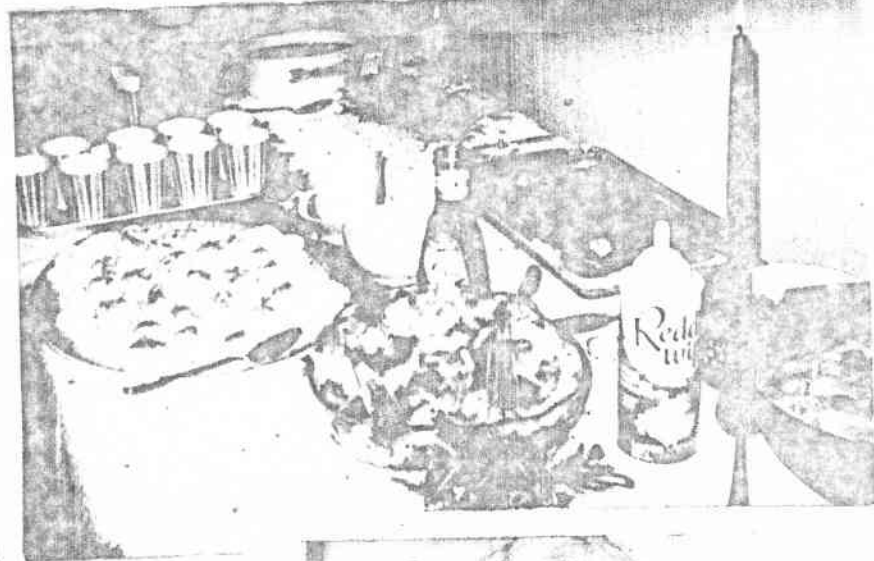
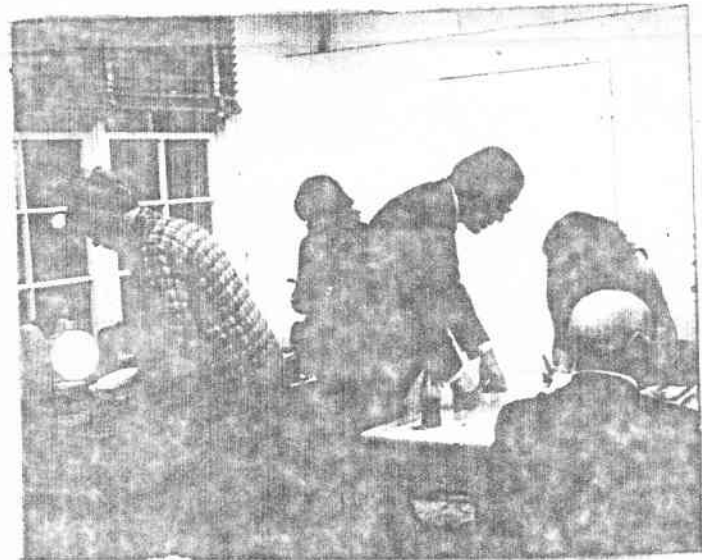

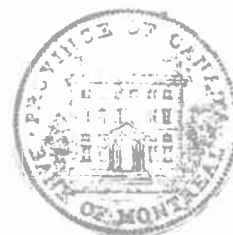
