ZEELANDIA: Illustrated here is a copper one duit (pro-  
nounced DOWT) coin of Zeelandia, dated 1796. Zeeland is  
a province in the southwest Netherlands and, at the time  
this coin was struck, was autonomous. The province's  
coat of arms depicted on the obverse is a shield (sur-  
mounted by a crown) bearing the figure of a royal lion  
facing left, partly submerged in water (Zeeland, which  
consists mainly of islands, is an area which has been  
reclaimed from the sea). Around the edge is the legend,  
"LUCTOR ET EMERGO". The reverse carries the name of the  
province in three lines, with three stars above and the  
date below. In the Netherlands scheme of currency, the  
duit held a position roughly equivalent to our one cent  
coin.

The North York Coin Club's 1973 Annual Coin Show, Bourse and White Elephant Sale, held on Saturday, March 10 at the North York Memorial Community Hall, was very successful. The show, which opened at 10:00 A. M. and ran until 10:00 P. M., attracted approximately 500 people. The nine dealers in attendance were reported very happy at the results.

Best of show was won by Paul Johnson. Ray Pleau was given a special Honourable Mention for his non-competitive display. First prize winners received cups and second place winners were given hand lettered certificates.
