Stan Clute gave a brief explanation of his time-chart display of Roman coins, which won first prize in the Miscellaneous category at the Peterborough Coin Show. Another member of our club, Basil Latham, placed second in the same category. Stan also mentioned obtaining a Peterborough Junior Coin Club "clipped" wooden nickel.

The Franklin Mint film "The Ultimate Achievement", borrowed from the C. N. A. Library, was shown at the meeting and enjoyed by everyone.

The Club auction has grown so large that it has now been necessary to reinstate a club custom of several years ago. Carl Anderson volunteered to be the runner during the auction.

The president noted the real dedication of our Secretary, Mrs. Lucille Colson, who attended the meeting despite the fact that it was her twenty-fifth wedding anniversary.

The three draw prizes were won by Jean Orr, Doug Mair and Louise Graham.
