GUEST SPEAKER; Mr. Scott McLaren, new owner of Canadian Coin News, recounted to the members some of his early impressions and experiences on becoming involved in publishing a numismatic paper.

Since taking over Mr. McLaren has travelled from coast to coast meeting many collectors and dealers. From this and reading Club Bulletins, also general correspondence, he has concluded that the hobby is healthy on all fronts, with a few soft spots due to local conditions. He was interested to note the dedication of many coin groups and enjoyed meeting with them.

Mr. McLaren described himself as already a convert to the philosophy that the spirit of numismatics called for the close co-operation of collectors and dealers. Everyone should strive to such an end in the interests of all. He pledged not only his editorial policy, but as well in his management of his paper to pursue this goal

At the conclusion Mr. McLaren was presented with an Honorary Membership for 1977.

THE AARON STORY

The suit brought by Robert Aaron against certain members of the Club's Executive came to trial on Feb. 10th, 1977.

Judge Grosberg presiding, informed Mr. Aaron that having read the various depositions, and noting that of the original complaints, all but two had been withdrawn, he would recess the court to permit the litigants to come to settlement of the matter rather than proceeding with the trial.

In the negotiations which followed, it was agreed that Mr. Aaron's suspension from the club would be lifted, on which being done his resignation would simultaneously take effect. In addition, Mr. Aaron would pay \$250.00 towards the legal costs of the defendants.

After the recess Judge Grosberg accepted the agreement and adjourned the case pending completion of the terms.

On March 9th, 1977, Judge Coe in Chambers received the consent of the parties and ordered that the action be dismissed.

The legal costs of the defense of the action instituted by Robert Aaron were \$951.50 of which he paid \$250.00, leaving the defendants to pay \$681.50. At the meeting of Feb. 21, 1977, the membership authorized payment of this amount of club's funds, the Executive were however authorized to accept donations to relieve the Club of this expense. At the time of writing this bulletin, the Club has already received a small contribution.
