In addition to the C.N.A. Library slide presentation, our next meeting will feature a report on the August 18th - 21st American Numismatic Association Convention held in Boston, Mass. A report will also be given on the recent Collingwood Coin and Stamp show. The meeting promises to be an eventful evening as it marks the 250th time our North York Coin Club has met since its inception in 1960.

LAST MEETING:

Calling the July 27th meeting to order, President Harvey Farrow conducted the On Time Attendance Draw. The name of Jean Orr was drawn and as she was absent, the prize will be \$6.00 at this month's meeting. Marvin Kay read the minutes of the June meeting, which were adopted by the chair. There were no new members for publication this month.

July's programme consisted of a show of C.N.A. Library slides on "Coinage of Edward VIII" and "Basic Terms of Numismatics". Commentary was provided by Harvey Farrow and Marvin Kay.

President Farrow then gave his report on the C.N.A. Convention held July 15th - 18th in downtown Winnipeg, Man. The convention included a tour of the Winnipeg mint on Friday evening, followed by a delegates breakfast Saturday morning. The North York Coin Club was represented by our President, Harvey Farrow, and one of the club's Directors, George Fraser. The concluding banquet was attended by 125 people. The C.N.A. Convention medal was on view and souvenirs were given away. A number of awards were presented at the banquet; these included the senior members awards, the J.D. Ferguson award (which went to our club's Jack Veffer), the Royal Canadian Mint award which went to "Scoop" Lewry for his work as Coin Week Canada chairman, and the Guy Potter award which was presented to Stanley Clute. Other awards included the best show at the convention (which went to Norman Wells), best scrap book for Coin Week Canada (Calgary Numismatic Association), best coin club bulletin (Regina Coin Club) and best provincial association bulletin (Atlantic provinces). At the show there were 100 display cases and 35 dealers were on hand.

Al Bliman then made reference to the Canadian Paper Money Society bronze medal which was presented to the club's George Fraser at the C.N.A. Convention for his work in the society. Congratulations should be extended to George for his accomplishment.

Marvin Kay gave a brief talk on the new Elora Trade Dollar and generously donated a specimen to the club.

Photographs of the N.Y.C.C.'s 22nd anniversary and 400th membership were on view throughout the meeting.
