Subsequent Meetings.....Thursday, December 11; Tuesday January 27.

Forty-one members and guests attended the 298th meeting of the NYCC on October 28th. Harvey Farrow presided. Three new members were welcomed....

Harvey Farrow asked for volunteers to man the NYCC table at TICF on November 21, 22 and 23, at the Lakeshore Inn. Then Harvey gave a summary of the Financial Report of the CNA, which was hosted by the NYCC in July/86. The venture showed a profit of nearly \$4000.00. This will be shared equally between the CNA and the NYCC. We will also share in profits from future sales of the remaining bronze and silver medals.

The Guest Speaker for the evening was our own member, Fred C Jewett, introduced by George Fraser. Fred is an authority on early Canadian paper money and he began his talk with a brief history of the origins of paper money. On display there were about twenty large Canadian banknotes, and Fred related an interesting anecdote about each note. Included in Fred's display were beautiful banknotes from the Bank of British North America, the Bank of New Brunswick and the Imperial Bank of Canada. We also saw a \$50.00 note from the Bank of Toronto, picturing the old Toronto City Hall. We also saw a note from the Westmoreland Bank. This note had the denomination changed illegally from Two Dollars up to Two Pounds.

Then George Fraser talked about some large size Canadian Charter Bank notes from his own collection. Harvey Farrow reminisced about some of his experiences with 'old' money and then thanked both speakers.

Ron Zelk listed the library locations for Coin Week Canada. This will take place in March and April of 1987. He asked for members to submit displays for the five locations. Then Ron presented medals of appreciation to the members of his committee for their hard work during the CNA convention. These were Jim Heifetz, Howard Richardson and Russ Brown.

At the September/86 meeting, Marvin Kay announced two contests for members of the NYCC. First, Marvin wanted to give away a set of his personal numismatic items, consisting of two bronze medals, four woods plus a souvenir sheet. Marvin read out two letters. One was a very funny letter from someone whose initials were 'J.R.' The winning letter came from from Wally Ciona, who wrote that he eventually intends to donate his collection to the Toronto Archives.

The second of Marvin's contests asked the members, "What would be the face value if you had one coin of each denomination of legal Canadian Coins issued since Confederation?" With the assistance of David Votruba, total was shown to be \$186.91. Because there were no correct entries in this contest, Marvin donated the prize, a beautiful book on paper money, to the Club Auction.

Following Ted Boxall's refreshments, we had the Lucky Draw and the Auction.
