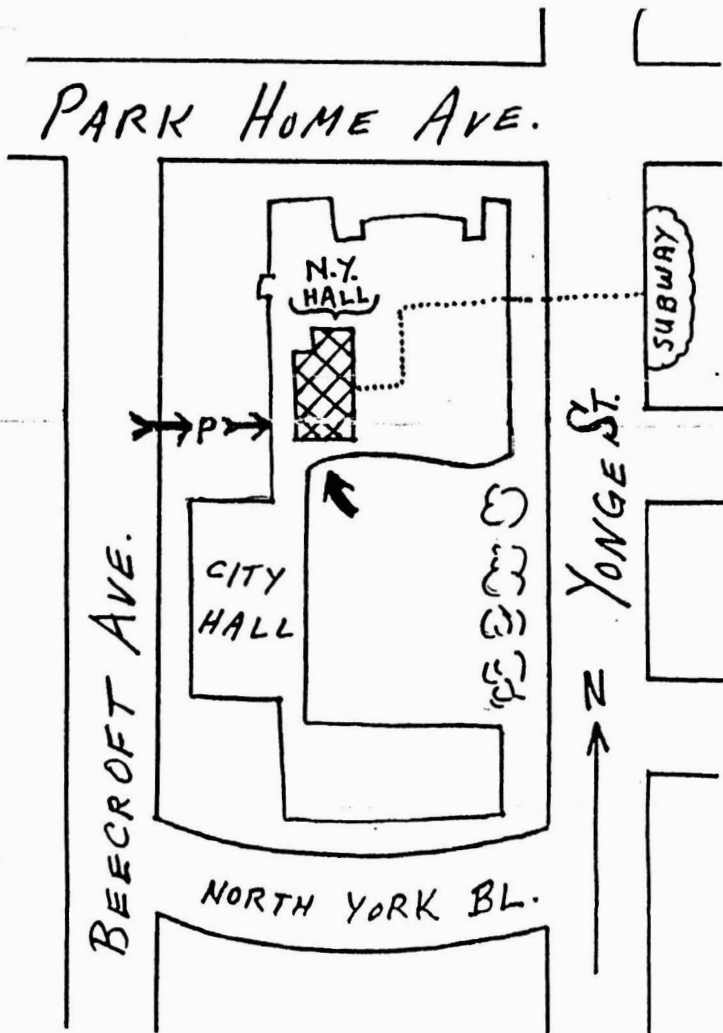

HOW TO GET TO THE NEW NORTH YORK MEMORIAL COMMUNITY HALL.....

The New North York Community Hall is located quite close to the site of the former building where we used to meet.

BY CAR.....There are a few parking meters on Beecroft Avenue. There is no charge after 6:00 PM. If there is no street parking available, use the underground parking garage. Enter from Beecroft Avenue. This is shown with a 'P' and two arrows on the map at the left. There is a flat fee of \$1.50. Then take the elevator UP one flight to the Burgundy Room, Part 'B'.

BY TTC.....The new Park Home subway station is now open. It is expected that the new walkway will be open so you can walk directly from the subway into the North York Community Center.
