DEAR CLUB MEMBER:

IT DOESN'T SEEM LIKE 30 YEARS SINCE THE CLUB WAS FOUNDED ON FEBRUARY 19, 1960, IN THE BASEMENT OF THE OLD NORTH YORK MEMORIAL COMMUNITY HALL, BUT TIME FLIES. A BIT OF TRAVIA: HOW MANY PRESIDENTS HAS THE N.Y.C.C. HAD? HOW MANY HAVE SERVED TWO DIFFERENT TIMES OVER THE YEARS? HOW MANY PLACES HAS THE CLUB HAD? THE ANSWERS TO THESE THREE QUESTIONS WILL BE GIVEN AT THE MEETING AND IF YOU ARE NOT THERE THEY WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE NEXT BULLETIN.

The 336th meeting of the N.Y.C.C. was held on Tuesday, January, 23, 1990. The president Ron Zelk welcomed the 27 members and no guests present.

The ON-TIME ATTENDANCE DRAW of \$4.00 was not won by GEORGE FRASER as he was not present, so next month will be \$6.00. RON ZELK took the minutes as LUCILLE COLSON was absent. The mint box was passed to 1 junior.

Since this meeting WAS THE ANNUAL MEETING, the FINANCIAL REPORT was read by HARVEY FARROW. Revenue \$1,406.33 less expenses \$1,890.09 for a 1989 loss of 483.76. It was noted that postage and room rent has dramatically increased along with the fact that the club paid for the CHRISTMAS DINNER which was part of the \$247.48 REFRESHMENT EXPENSE. With a cost per member of \$23.93 and the fact that since 1970 (when they were \$5.00) the club has only increased the dues once to \$7.00 in 1982 that it was time to increase the dues to \$10.00 to help with the increasing costs of the club.

THE EVENING WAS COMPLETED BY A C.N.A. SLIDE PRESENTATION ON "A SELECTION OF PAPER MONEY FROM THE J. DOUGLAS FERGUSON COLLECTION" WITH THE NARRATION BY PAUL JOHNSON. THERE WAS A DISCUSSION OF THE CLUB'S 30th ANNIVERSARY DINNER. THE CONCLUSION WAS TO HAVE A DINNER AT THE KEG IN THE SHEPARD CENTRE ON SAT. MAR 31, 1990 (HOWEVER THERE ARE CONFLICTS SO THE DATE WAS MOVED TO SAT. APR. 7, 1990. THE COST WILL BE \$25.00 PER PERSON.

At the break COFFEE and COOKIES were served by TED BOXALL.

JOHN REGITKO ANNOUNCED THAT THE SPRING T.I.C.F. WILL NOT BE HELD AT THE LAKESHORE INN IN MARCH, OR ANY OTHER PLACE.
