Question-of-the-Month

This month we have a discussion-style question: if you were advising a novice collector on the selection of coin holders, what advice would you give. See if you can come up with four simple guidelines.

The four-part question of the month for August asked: what is the smallest denomination commemorative coin issued? What was the event? What is the design? Who is the designer? If you are like Al Bliman, who got the answer, you know it is the one cent of 1967 marking the centennial of Canadian Confederation. This piece, like all the denominations for 1967 excluding the \$20 gold piece, was designed by Nova Scotia artist Alex Coleville. It shows a Rock Dove, representing spiritual values and peace. Coleville provided the mint with the sculpted master for each of his 1967 designs.
